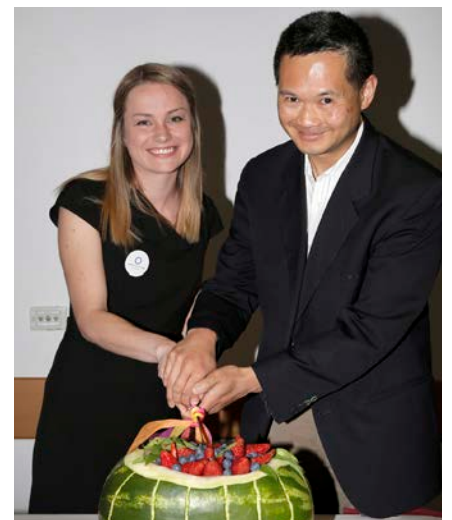

Extra diabetes support

SWSLHD is leading the fight against diabetes by rolling out new services and staff across the region to support the more than 55,000 people affected by the disease in south western Sydney.

Local people living with diabetes will have access to a range of services at Liverpool, Campbelltown, Bankstown-Lidcombe, Fairfield, Camden and Bowral & District Hospitals over the next four years.

The services were launched on World Diabetes Day and will support both children and adults with Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes, Gestational Diabetes, Mellitus and rarer forms of diabetes.

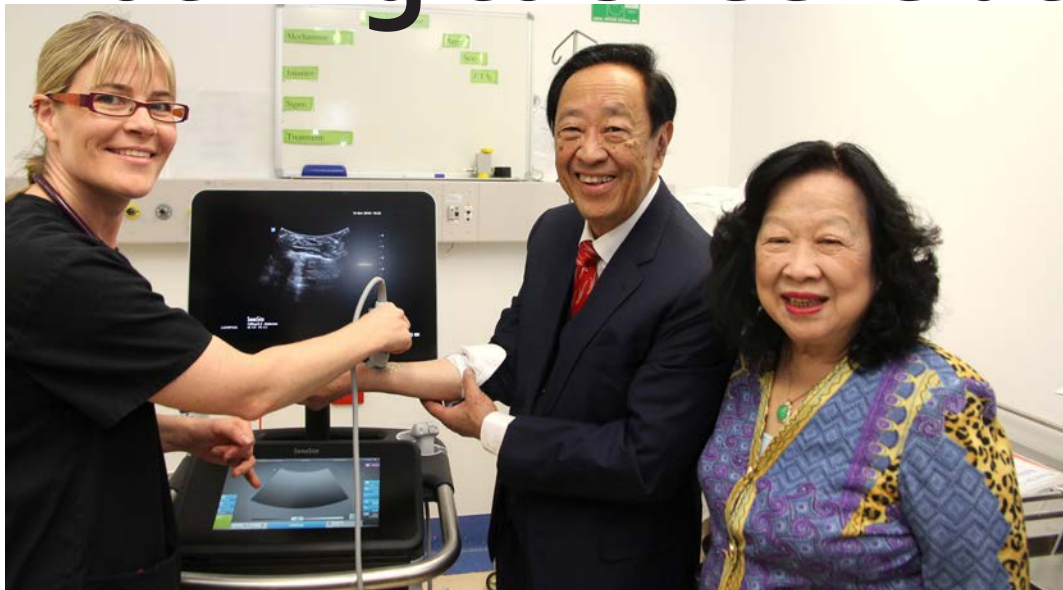
These are the findings of SWSLHD's latest Health Snapshot, which reports on the health status and lifestyle behaviours of the people of south western Sydney.
